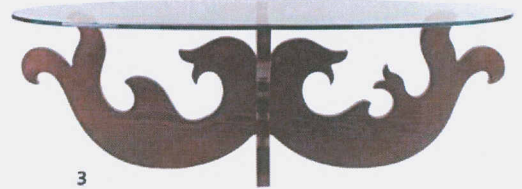
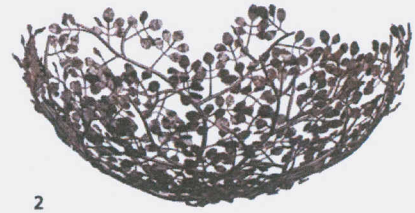
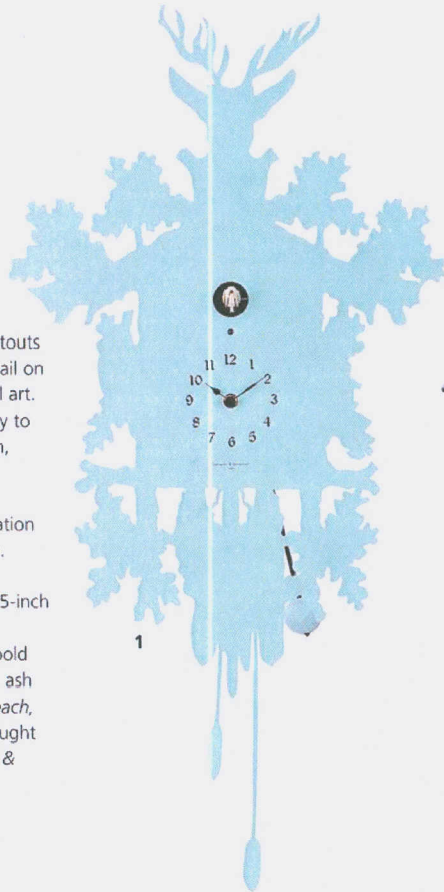


CUT IT OUT!
